Our next Fordbridge league match was against **Stanwell** at home on a rare sunny day. It was a win for Staines 83-53 winning on 3-rinks. This gave us an 8-2 win.

It was a bump down from the top when we lost on all 4-rinks in the Fordbridge League against Fordbridge Park, away. We lost 57-75 giving all 10 points away. Still, we have the return leg to come.

Another tough match on the normal bumpy green at **Osterley** which resulted in a loss of 56-64. This is a point loss of 2-8 but we had one winning rink of David Gray, John Geisha and skip Wend Ridley.

We face the annual problem of the disappearing Staines ladies, unable to find four of them we had, for the first time, field a rink of all men. A rule change we were initially against, but now find necessary. The rules of the Fordbridge league were changed this season but the result was unfortunately another loss this time against **Hounslow Cons**. 53-62 resulting in another 2-8 points' loss. We did again have one winning rink, this time John Geisha, Wendy Ridley and skip Roger Lintott.

Although Staines have disappearing ladies other teams have disappearing members as both Cambridge Park and Sunningdale have called **to cancel their fixtures**. The Sunningdale fixture was the second leg of the Cup fixture and they have requested if we can play later in the season as many of their best players are away on holiday.
