

14th May 2021

After a long wait the green finally opened on the 26th April. First out was President Dot who looked like she had never been away! A session of Back to Bowls got us in the mood and it was a full house for the first official game on Tuesday. We were limited to 24 but as of the 17th May we can play up to 30 in roll-ups and casual play and in organised matches and games we are back to full capacity.

We were soon feeling the effects of the unsettled weather as our second Back to Bowls session was rained off, but on the Thursday we were playing our first away match with 2 triples at picturesque Wraysbury. We were privileged to be the first on to their brand new artificial surface. This took a little getting used to but a close game ensued with the home side just pipping it by 2 shots, with a fine performance by top rink Jill Walker, Rita Moore and Wendy Ridley.

Graeme's first Early Practice session took place on the Friday morning with 18 keen bowlers out to regain bowling skills in a mixture of singles and pairs games. This series will consist of 6 Friday mornings – a useful way to improve as we get back into the bowling habit!

Our first match on grass took place on Saturday May 1st as we travelled to Ottershaw. On a cloudy day and a swingy green we had early leads but they evaporated as the home side got into its stride. The second was away on the 11th at Windsor Great Park where they played a mixed team, but won comfortably 63-29. Top rink was Moira Matthews, Jill Walker and Rita Moore. They certainly earned their cream tea in the gazebo afterwards!...

Our 2-leg competition against Bishop Duppas saw its 1st leg on 8th May with 3 rinks both Home and Away for safety. After a morning of heavy rain the greens were inspected and pronounced playable. It was nice to see 24 Staines members out there bowling and the result was a Home win 60-55 with top rink Nick Kirby, Rita Woods, Roy Holdaway and Derek Keogh finishing 25-9. Away we were up against some very seasoned players but we had 1 winning rink skipped by Chris Morrison. Overall we go into the 2nd leg a mere -11 on aggregate. 4th June 2021

It was a pleasant afternoon for our game against Knaphill on 9th May but we were only able to manage a draw on 1 rink skipped by Eric Moore with Gillian Watkins as lead and Mike Davies as 2, with our visitors prevailing on the other 2 rinks.

The weather continued changeable over the next week or so, with one SML game and a friendly rained off. At Heathervale on the 15th May the decision was made to play, and some interesting bowling took place under a mixture of sunshine and scudding clouds. Rain was due after 4 pm and at about 4.15 a heavy hailstorm (with added thunder) hit us, stopping the match at about 14 ends. Some interesting bowls including a dead end followed straight away by a tied end on one rink! Our visitors won on 2 rinks but top rink of Tony Smith, Mike Davies and Derek Keogh carried the day with a score of 29-7 making it a 51-42 win for Staines. The evening was rounded off by drinks and a light supper in the clubhouse.

More friendlies followed with a draw against Iver Heath on the 20th, 39-39, a win at Walton on the 22nd, 55-33, top rink Delphine Palmowski, Joyce Woodward and Derek Keogh. A reduced game at Byfleet on the 29th saw a narrow win for Staines 30-27 after a fight back by Wendy Ridley on a challenging green. Top rink was Maureen Burrell. Mike Davies and Derek Keogh.

The annual Denman triples took place with just 17 players but provided a few hours' pleasant bowling, stopping for lunch after 2 games of 5 ends with another 3 after. Having just 2 woods did concentrate the mind and the most concentrated were the winners Richard Cosstick, Dave Atkinson and Clive Stevens.

Staines Ladies did not fare so well against Chertsey Ladies on their added game on the 25th but won away against Bishop Duppas ladies on the 27th 44-38. Top rink with a convincing 21-10 score was Maureen Burrell, Jill Walker and skip Moira Matthews. A visit from Sunningdale Ladies on the 1st June yielded a 30-18 win, top rink Sheila Rogers, Jill Walker and skip Joyce Woodward. The Royal Household came to us on the 3rd and it was another Staines win, 40-22, top rink Sheila Rogers, Rita Moore and Wendy Ridley.

Our 2-leg competition against Bishop Duppas concluded with another home and away on the 30th May, in much finer weather than the first leg! Going into the 2nd leg only -11 on aggregate we stood a chance and out of 6 rinks we won on 3, skipped by Eric Moore, Chris Morrison and on the top rink Derek Keogh assisted by Jill Walker, Dave Atkinson and Clive Lintott. If you need a hat please wear it and appropriate sunscreen too! A damp towel round the neck can help too. Shorts (white or grey depending) are permitted as long as they are tailored, or made by a recognised bowls supplier.



13th July 2021

The 2nd and 3rd of our SML matches were played at home at the end of June starting with the rescheduled Teddington encounter on Tuesday 29th. It was a Staines win against the visitors who are new to the South Middlesex League and who were anxious to be off to watch England beat Germany in the Euros! Rain helped by shortening the game by a few ends on 2 rinks. It ended 8-2 to Staines with an aggregate of 70-52. Top rink Gillian Watkins, Rita Moore and Derek Keogh.

On the 30th we played Sunbury Sports, also at home. This was a tighter match, ending with a win for Staines 6-4 and just a 4 shot advantage 64-60. The weather was a little kinder to us but we were up against some very good players with the top rink going to Mike Leonard, Roy Holdaway and Joyce Marshall 18-9.

Our ongoing friendlies saw us at Richings Park on the 27th June on a cloudy but largely rainless afternoon. Some ups and downs in the 3 triples gave the home side a win of just four shots, with our top rink going to Allan Pilling, Joyce Marshall and skip Eric Moore winning their rink 27-20. After the successes in our 2 SML matches we were away at Hampton in a first-time mixed friendly. Alas we couldn't master their green but well done to Wendy Ridley who recovered to just one down after a slow start and also to Celia Pittman, Joyce Marshall and Clive Stevens who had the only winning rink.

We won on 3 rinks but the home side had an 18 shot lead at the end so got the aggregate points. Top rink was Delphine Palmowski (in a welcome return to fitness), Mike Davies and John Smith, whom it was also good to see back on the green! Thanks to Sheila Rogers for playing at short notice.

The next day we were at Fordbridge Park for another SML match but this time we just lost out to the home side 4-6. Again we were interrupted by a heavy downpour and came out to play again on a rather damper green. Top rink Jill Walker, Mike Davies and Derek Keogh.

Then on the 10th July it was the 2nd leg of the Sunningdale Cup match, this time away. We went into this with the Ladies having a 45 shot advantage and the Men 10. In the leafy surroundings of the Sunningdale green both the 2 Men's rinks and the 2 Ladies triples won and the final scores over both legs were 107-49 to the Ladies, 93-64 to the Men. Top rinks – Ladies, Joyce Marshall, Gill Pitfield and Rita Moore – Men, Graeme Hinton, Allan Pilling, Roy Holdaway and Eric Moore. A solid win and well done to the Ladies for retaining the Simes Cup and the Men for bringing home the Catley Cup for the first time since 2014! 1st August 2021

Following our heady wins at Sunningdale it was back down to earth with a flurry of TVL matches. Versus Masonian on the 15th July skip John Smith added some late shots to help us to an away win alongside winning rink Rita Moore, Mike Davies and John Hay, though at home we were up against the relentless Dave Pitt and his fellows. An overall loss but by a creditable 6 points to 7. Against Mid Surrey on the 20th we had 1 winning rink of Tony Smith, Roy Holdaway and Derek Keogh 22-9, but the match went 2-10 against us. And against Bishop Duppas on the 22nd the best we could manage was 1 tied rink away from Roger Lintott, Mike Davies and Wendy Ridley 15-15 with 5 shots added on the last end! Overall 1.5-12 points to our opponents.

Somehow we also managed to play 2 SML games that same weekend but with more success. The annual Spelthorne Trophy all-day 3-way tournament involving Staines, Bishop Duppas and this year Fordbridge Park was on the next day Sunday 1st August at Bishop Duppas. After (a barbecue) lunch Clive Lintott led his mixed triple to a 29-18 win with the help of Sheila Rogers and Bob Blackett. Alas those were the extent of our wins though Chris Morrison in the second men's singles gave a good account of himself with only a 4 shot difference at the end.
